GUIDELINES FOR MEDIA VISITING ULURU-KATA TJUTA NATIONAL PARK

For the local Indigenous people, the whole area covered by Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park is of enormous spiritual and cultural significance and it is important for visiting media to be aware that strict photography and filming restrictions are in place for images, vision and sound recorded in and around the park, particularly if it is intended for public display or commercial use.
